


• Step 1: Identify Issue

• **Grant Goal:** Enhance access to evidence-based, comprehensive, coordinated, culturally competent, and family-centered care for children and youth with autism and other developmental disabilities in underserved areas.




- Step 2: Identify Community Champions
 - Primary Care Practice Champions in each of 4 regions
- Step 3: Key Stakeholder Meetings
 - Initial small meetings in each community, hosted by Champions
 - Generate larger list of local partners, stakeholders & resources
 - Create "invitation list" for larger meetings




- Step 4: Larger "Town Hall" Community Action Meeting
 - Facilitated meetings (3 ½ hours) in each community
 - Larger group of stakeholders
 - Lunch, networking, & relationship-building
 - Guided process of identifying strengths, gaps, priorities for supporting children with or at-risk for autism and other developmental disabilities
 - Following the pyramid-to-pie framework

• Step 4: Larger "Town Hall" Community Action Meeting




CAM Process: Identifying Resources

- After resources were "mapped," gaps and key issues were identified
- Stakeholders then voted on their top priorities


CAM Process: Top Priorities & Champions

 - Smaller "goal groups" were formed to work on each goal
 - Each group works together with logistical support
- Members share & Learn through the Virtual Learning
 Community (VLC)
 - Monthly Sessions (Zoom)
 - > 100 attendees






